Demographics of Jail Inmates

- Estimated 721,300 people in jail
- Nearly 13 million people admitted to jails every year
- Average jail inmate:
 - Adult male
 - Not sentenced

NC Prisons vs. Jails

Adult Prisons

- Operate multiple facilities
- Sentenced only
- Facilities vary by security level

Jails

- Usually only one facility
- Mixture of sentenced and pre-trial
- House ALL security levels


NC Jail Population




NC Jail Inmates (Dec. 31, 2013)
















Other Stats

Jail Perpetrators Target:

- · Female inmates
- · Biracial or multiracial inmates
- · Younger inmates
- · College-educated inmates
- Inmates who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, and "other" sexual orientation
- Inmates who experienced prior sexual abuse

Prison Rape Elimination Act Overview

2003- PREA Legislation passed unanimously 2012- DOJ issues final PREA standards

National Standards are binding to:

- Prisons
- Jails
- · Youth Detention Facilities
- Police Lockups
- · Community Corrections

PREA Standards

- · Keep people safe
- Protect survivors from abusers
- · Provide multiple ways to report
- · Offer medical and mental health care
- · Increase accountability
- · Provide survivors access to victim services

Importance of Advocates

- · Impact of sexual abuse in jails
- · Need for rape crisis advocacy
- · High rates of sexual abuse in large jails (urban)
- Lack of available services (rural)

Providing Services to Jail Inmates

- · Be sensitive to high level of need among the inmate population
- · Anticipate resistance and possible disruptions in services
- · Focus on continuity of care for survivors leaving jail

Tips for Working with Inmates

- · Focus on the victimization, not the incarceration
- · Get to know the jail facility, staff, and inmates
- · Remember that most inmates are members of your community
- · Affirm your commitment to serve all survivors, regardless of their background




Partnership Opportunities


